Policy Summary	NCG Learner Support Fund policy for 2021/22. This policy sets out the rules which all NCG colleges must follow in supporting learners with financial support. There is now this one policy for all NCG colleges. However, it is recognised that colleges will need to have local finance guides for learners. Compliance with the NCG policy is a requirement.

1. Purpose

This policy sets out the eligible criteria and entitlements which NCG colleges offer to learners from the Learner Support Funds, based on the ESFA funding rules and guidance. It allows some discretion to set appropriate support which align to the local needs of the colleges.

This policy ensures funds are allocated to assist learners in reducing barriers to education and to encourage engagement for those from disadvantaged backgrounds by providing financial support.

2. Background

This is the first year an NCG Learner Support Fund policy is in place. This policy will ensure consistency across NCG whilst allowing colleges to have local arrangements where appropriate.

3. Scope

This policy is to outline the financial support that can be awarded to eligible students in the 2021/22 academic year, from the following discretionary fund bursaries:

- 16-19 Discretionary Bursary Fund.
- 16-19 Vulnerable Bursary Fund.
- 19+ Discretionary Learner Support Fund.
- Advanced Learner Loan Bursary.

NCG will assess the student's actual need for financial assistance before determining whether to award financial support and the amount that is awarded.

The bursaries are a discretionary award and financial support is conditional on attendance. The expectation is that students achieve 100% attendance however there is an appreciation that in some cases financial hardship can result in a lowering of attendance. Support will be provided when a student achieves 90% or above attendance (including authorised absence) across all parts of their programme. College have the discretion at a local level to provide support to learners who have attendance lower than 90%.

Learners who do not demonstrate behaviours in line with the student code of conduct may have their support cancelled.

The Learner Support Funds Policy is based on the funding guidelines at the time of writing this policy; NCG reserves the right to amend the policy should the funding guidelines change.

The budget for financial support to students is finite. Students who may be eligible for support may not automatically receive it once the limited funds have been exhausted (with the exception of those who qualify for the 16-19 Vulnerable Bursary Fund). Early application for funding is therefore advised.

4. 16-19 Bursary

To be eligible for the discretionary bursary, students need to meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Aged 16 or over but under 19 at 31 August 2021.
- Aged 19 or over at 31 August 2021 and have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).
- Aged 19 or over at 31 August 2021 and continuing on a study programme they began aged 16-18 ('19+ continuers').
- Meet the residency criteria in ESFA 2021/22 academic year funding regulations for post 16 provision.
- Be participating in provision funded by ESFA.
- An asylum seeker who has legally been in the UK for six months or longer while their claim is being considered by the Home Office, and no decision on their claim has been made.
- A member of a household whose gross income is below £30,000 , OR resident in a household receiving a means tested benefit (i.e. Income Support/Job Seekers Allowance/Employment Support Allowance/Universal Credit and earning less than £30,000.
- Experiencing financial hardship and has been identified as being in exceptional need. Assessments of household income can take into account any unearned income such as shares/investments and savings.

5. 16-19 Vulnerable Bursary

To be eligible for the vulnerable bursary, students need to be in one of the defined vulnerable groups:

- In care (including unaccompanied Asylum Seeker students).
- OR a care leaver.
- OR a student in receipt of Income Support, or Universal Credit because they are financially supporting themselves or financially supporting themselves and someone who is dependent on them and living with them such as a child or partner.
- OR a student receiving Disability Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payments in their own right as well as Employment and Support Allowance or Universal Credit in their own right.

6. Free Meals in further education

To be eligible for Free Meals, students need to be in receipt of, or have parents who are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits:

- Income support.

- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance.
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA).
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- The guarantee element of State Pension Credit.
- Child Tax Credit (provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190, as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs (HMRC)).
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for 4 weeks after someone stops qualifying for Working Tax Credit.
- Universal Credit with net earnings not exceeding the equivalent of £7,400 pa (after tax and not including any benefits you get).

7. 19+ Discretionary Learner Support Fund and Advanced Learner Loan Bursary

To be eligible for Discretionary Learner Support Fund or Advanced Learner Loan bursary, students need to meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Aged 19 years or over on 31 August 2021.
- Studying a Further Education programme of study funded by ESFA/Devolved Authority at Newcastle College.
- Have an approved Advanced Learner Loan in place if receiving funding to cover the cost of course fees.
- Meet the residency and eligibility for funding criteria as stated in the Adult Education Budget/Devolved Authority funding and performance management rules 21/22 or the Advanced Learner Loan funding rules.
- In receipt of a means tested benefit in their own right (i.e. Income Support/Job Seekers Allowance/Working Tax Credit up to free prescription level/Employment Support Allowance/Universal Credit).
- OR Living in a single independent household and has a gross household income of between £7,800 and £15,000.
- OR Living in a household, consisting of the student and their partner/spouse/parent(s) that has a gross household income of less than £30,000.
- Experiencing financial hardship and have been identified as being in exceptional need.

It is the learner's responsibility to inform the Department for Work and Pensions about any learner support they are receiving, as these payments may affect their eligibility to state benefits.

20+ Discretionary Learner Support Fund and Advanced Learner Loan Bursary - Childcare Fund

To be eligible for the childcare funds, students need to meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Aged 20 years or over on 31 August 2021.
- Studying a Further Education programme of study funded by ESFA/Devolved Authority at Newcastle College.
- Have an approved Advanced Learner Loan in place if receiving funding to cover the cost of course fees.
- Meet the residency and eligibility for funding criteria as stated in the Adult Education Budget funding and performance management rules 21/22 or the Advanced Learner Loan funding rules 21/22.
- In receipt of a means tested benefit in their own right (i.e. Income Support/Job Seekers Allowance/ Employment Support Allowance/Universal Credit and earning less than £30,000).
- OR Living in a single independent household and has a gross household income of between £7,800 and £15,000 or £8,580.
- OR Living in a household, consisting of the student and their partner/spouse/parent(s) that has a gross household income of less than £30,000.
- Be financially responsible for the child that requires childcare.
- Experiencing financial hardship and have been identified as being in exceptional need.

Learner attendance will be monitored and funding may be stopped if learner's attendance falls below an expectable level.

8. Emergency Support

A student may receive emergency financial support following an interview with a nominated member of staff to establish need. Sums paid will vary and may or may not be repayable, but will be the minimum required to meet the need. For emergency help a student may not have to meet the support fund financial eligibility criteria. Decisions will be made on a case by case basis.

9. Asylum Seekers

Asylum Seekers are eligible to access the discretionary hardship funds in the form of course related books, equipment and trip costs or a travel pass but they must not be given support in the form of cash. This support will be offered at relevant points during the academic year and be subject to continuing satisfactory attendance of 90% (including authorised absences) across all parts of their programme.

10. Care to Learn

Childcare costs for learners aged 16-19 will be met via the 'Care to Learn' national scheme. Nominated staff in each College will assist learners with these applications and will complete the monthly attendance reports.

11. Hardship Fund

The Hardship Fund will be used to support students who do not meet the eligibility criteria for any of the other funds but is in financial hardship and needs support. These funds are limited and will be available to students on a first come first served based. This fund will be managed by Newcastle College Learner Support Fund Team.

12. Overpayments

NCG reserves the right to amend learner support based upon changes to timetables available at the initial point of assessment; overpayment of funds may be recovered from the learner.

13. Administration Costs

NCG will use 5% of each fund allocation for administration costs (excluding 16-19 Vulnerable Bursary).

14. Covid-19

Support provided to learners may change in-year as a result of the exceptional circumstances due to coronavirus (COVID-19). For example, where it may not be financially viable to provide a travel pass at the commencement of the 2021/22 academic year, cash payments may be made as an alternative, which will be calculated based upon travel company ticket costs and campus timetabled sessions. Where in-year it is identified that a travel pass is more financially viable, payments may stop and travel passes purchased for learners. NCG will provide support to learners based on what is considered to be the most financially viable, to ensure that funds are used effectively and can reach as many eligible learners as possible.

We may publish further updates to this policy due to the impact of coronavirus (COVID-19) and the updated guidance from the ESFA.

15. How to apply

Each college within NCG has an application form which learners are required to complete and submit, with evidence to the College nominated staff. Please see the college websites for details.

16. Appeals

If a student wishes to appeal a decision regarding support, the appeal should be made to the college nominated staff within 7 working days of the original decision.

17. Publication
